Many countries are entering an aging society which is considered a significant population structure change. Understanding the context of the city can no longer overlook, which can help for suitable recommendations about elderly care with different forms and patterns of the built environment inaccurate identification and correct understanding. The site investigation and a questionnaire survey of the total 1,200 homes of older people were conducted at Ban Phaeo district of Samutsakorn Province, Thailand. The investigations allow us to understand each community's different characteristics under the context of 4 dimensions: 1) housing characteristics, 2) transportation, 3) public facilities, and 4) social and economic. With different unique characteristics of elderly houses, primarily social, economic, transportation and housing aspects, the provision of a suitable environment has become the critical issue to provide solutions for effective interventions to support healthy rural aging according to the specific needs of communities.
