Health systems in low and middle-income countries have evolved in a context where the primary concerns were around ensuring availability of and access to health services. Many of these countries, particularly in Asia (e.g. Bangladesh, India, Vietnam) have since transitioned to, or are rapidly transitioning to middle income status. These countries are becoming more affluent, and their citizens are no longer satisfied with mere availability of healthcare and are demanding that health system be more responsive to their expectations. These transitions present challenges and opportunities for policy, practice, and research alike. This lecture introduces what entails a responsive health system, and what elements constitute it.
